### Beaujolais-Villages

The Beaujolais wine region is mainly situated in the Rhone region. This is a very important wine region as it represents half of the surface of the Bourgogne wine region. The character of these wines is very different to the other wines of Burgundy, except for the red Maconnais wines, north of Beaujolais, which use the same grape variety.

This is a regional appellation which means that the grapes are picked in 38 villages of the Beaujolais region. □

### Grape Variety

100% Gamay

Colour	Violet and limpid
Nose	Fruity, cherry, banana and floral aromas
Palate	Fleshy, with banana and fruit salad flavours fresh and fruity.
Ageing	It will easily keep three years , it is a wine that is meant to be drunk young
Service	The ideal serving temperature is between 10°C and 12°C.
